UNICEF

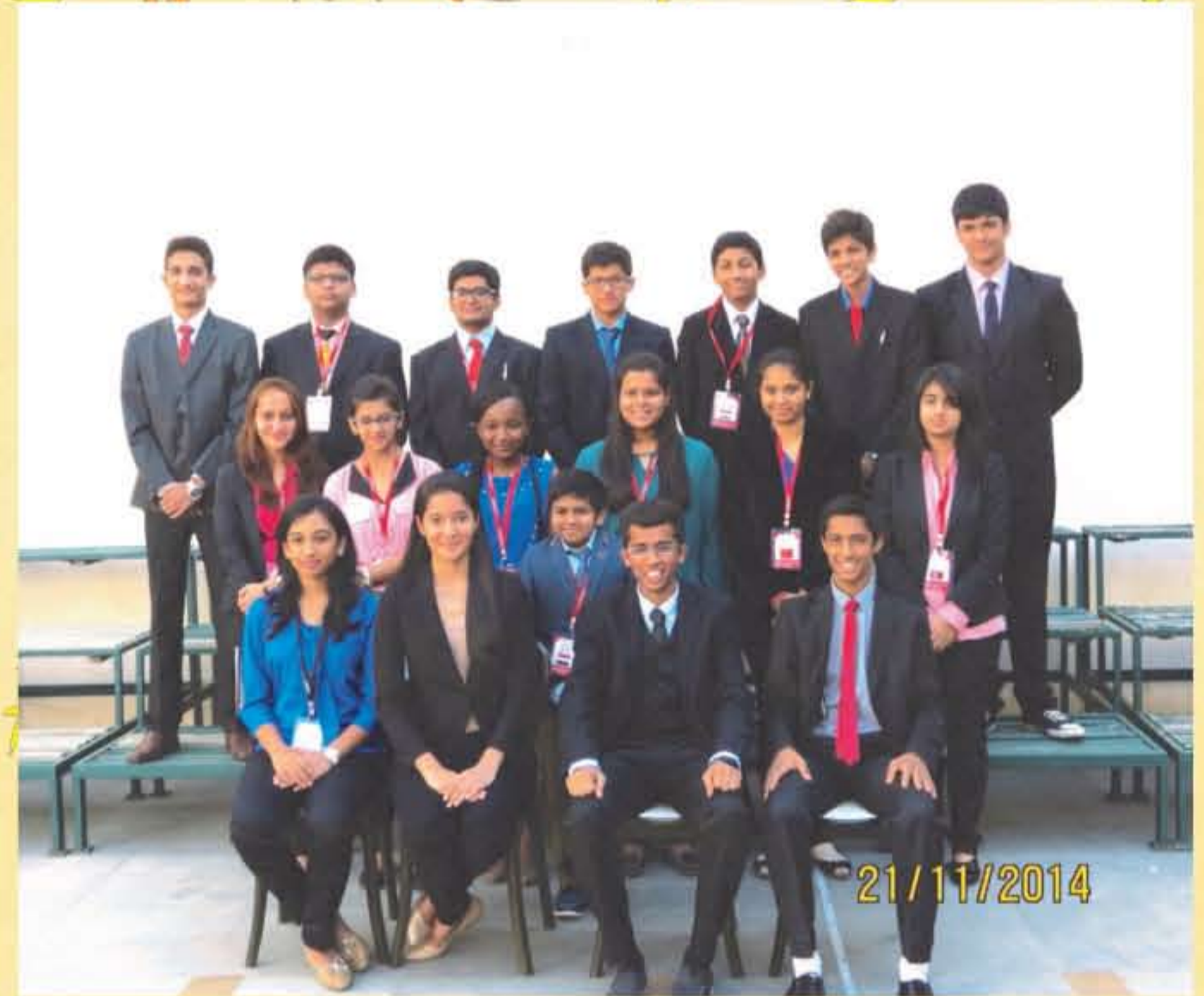
UNHSC
